DILIZAN (IRE) was unhurried in the middle of the pack in the first circuit, readily advanced on the western hill, waited patiently to the second-last fence, was quick when asked nearing the stretch, dueled over the last fence and drew off without urging. CLASS LAUNCH was outrun through eleven fences, had a powerful rally on the eastern hill to gain a short lead into the stretch but was no match for the winner while clearly second best. HAPPY DIGGER held a clear early lead, dueled uphill on the western hill, stalked the pace through eight fences, rallied to gain command on the western hill, increased his lead on the schoolhouse hill, held a clear lead at the top of the eastern hill but was done before the last fence. SEARUBYRUN rated in the middle of the pack through the first circuit, was outrun up the western hill and to the second-last fence, had a good rally to the stretch but failed to sustain his bid. PARADE LAP stalked the pace through the first circuit and tired on the western hill. EL SEASON trailed to the second-last fence and then passed tired rivals. TIME OFF was outrun. MEETING stalked the pace through eight fences, quickly took command before the ninth fence, dueled briefly, waited to launch his bid after the second-last fence and quickly went after the leader before he broke down. HIDDEN TRAIL pressed the early pace, gained command on the eastern hill, led to the start of the second circuit, tired on the western hill and pulled up before the eleventh fence.
