### Footnotes

UNCLE WOGER was away alertly and set the pace to the outside of TAILOR'S THREAD, drew clear around the turn and was much the best in the drive. The latter pressed the early pace along the rail, dropped back through the turn and finished evenly in the stretch passing a tired QUEST MASTER at the end getting up for place. QUEST MASTER stalked the early pace 3 wide, roused at the 1/4 pole, but could not close any ground on the winner and weakened in the late going. SEISMIC REPORT was void of early speed just off the rail, found his best stride late and closed between horses. ALASKAN SUNBURN was unhurried early between horses, then tired in the stretch. AIR COOL was allowed to settle outside of rivals and lacked a late response. JAZZ MUSICIAN was void of early speed along the rail and never a threat.
