Footnotes

FAR AND NEAR closed along the rail on the backstretch, angled three-wide chasing after the leader midturn, finished determinedly and got up late. SCINTILLATING led quickly, set a pressured pace, shook clear late turn then was all out but failed to hold the winner safe in deep stretch. FEELING NAUGHTY, always in range, angled five-wide leaving the turn while closing steadily then rallied outside. WINDINTHEVALLEY stalked three-wide, was hustled on the turn but tired in the final furlong. PANIEMONIAM stalked the pace, forced the issue into the turn, chased, then tired at the top of the stretch. PIERSIXER, off a step slowly, trailed along the rail, was hustled through the turn then evened out in the stretch. LA GRAN DOMENIQUE, close early, began to fade late backstretch and lacked a further response.
