Footnotes

LANGSTAFF settled off the early pace, was steadied when blocked along the rail late turn, was again blocked upper stretch, angled out with a 16th to run, rallied smartly and was just up. CLICK set a reserved pace, was engaged midstretch, battled all out and held that rival safe but was caught by the winner near the wire. SKYRISH broke outward and bumped a rival, moved up to force the pace into the turn, pressed the issue to the stretch, challenged a furlong out, dueled to the end but was outfinished. SAN NICOLA THUNDER raced in midpack, saved ground then finished evenly. CANUSPELLPATIENCE stalked the pace, chased three-wide into the stretch then evened out in the late stages. GO SHERMIN GO, bumped at the start, raced off the pace, was squeezed back from tight quarters at the turn, chased four-wide then flattened out in the stretch. FIGHTING CHRIS raced in midpack, came five-wide through the turn, chased into the stretch but failed to threaten. PHIL THE FOX settled off the pace, came three to five-wide through the turn, chased into the stretch but did not menace. A LIFETIME OF WAR raced in midpack, was four-wide on the turn, chased into the stretch then tired in the final furlong. THE B'S AND E'S raced off the pace, was set down at the top of the stretch but was squeezed back along the rail a furlong out then evened out.
