Footnotes

YOU'RE SUCH A DEEE stalked the early pace just off the rail, rallied four wide on the turn, dueled inside of CRIMSON LAKE while off the rail in the drive and prevailed under strong pressure. CRIMSON LAKE was allowed to settle just off the rail, rallied five wide on the turn, dueled outside of the winner in the drive, but was outfinished. INTERNATIONAL CITY was unhurried early, rallied in the two path on the turn, came three wide in the drive and finished well. JUBE JUBE broke sharply and vied for the early lead four wide, then weakened in the late going. PETITE DAPHNEE was hustled along inside of rivals, drew clear approaching the far turn, then got tired in the stretch. MY VALLEY GIRL pressed the early pace between horses, then tired in the stretch and dropped back. BROOM HILDA was shuffled back at the start and void of early speed, never rallied and was never a factor. NITSA D was allowed to settle along the rail and never rallied. HALOS AND STRIPES vied for the early lead in the backstretch, then faltered on the turn and dropped back.
