EDENWOLD, unhurried early closed three-wide on the turn, bid upper stretch and drove clear. DAKOTA FREEWAY bobbled at the start, settled midpack, was roused four-wide on the turn and finished gamely in vain. ARABIAN STAR advanced along the rail late backstretch, was hustled through the turn, failed with a bid upper stretch and hung. ITALIANO chased from early stages then tired in the final furlong. TUGASKE moved up to take the early lead, set the pace, was engulfed by rivals upper stretch and yielded. PRINCELY PICKLE gained mildly along the rail through the turn and never reached contention. TWO FACE FLYER, well back early, was hustled late backstretch, saved ground on the turn but was never a factor. MR. MACDUFF was hustled along the second path, faded on the turn then lacked a rally. CIFERCAT, well back early, saved ground but lacked a closing response.
