MO STAR pulled to the fore, dueled on the backstretch, gained the lead early turn and moved clear late turn then widened under a drive and held sway. SALUTING STORMYE stalked the pace, chased three-wide late turn and finished evenly. COOK'S LOOK raced midpack, came four and five-wide through the turn, chased into the stretch and rallied determinedly. BATHSHEBA STATION, rated midpack, was hustled two-wide on the turn then rallied gamely. ROMAN GAMES raced off the pace, angled four to seven-wide through the turn then rallied from far back. MOLINARO FORT raced midpack, was hustled

four-wide on the turn but evened out in deep stretch. SHY LOVER, in touch, came four-wide through the turn, chased into the stretch then evened out in the late stages. LOST THE RING dueled, yielded early turn but chased to the stretch and tired. DARE TO BE BEST raced off the pace, was hustled hard late turn but never reached contention. LOUIS forced the pace, was steadied sharply in tight quarters along the rail entering the turn, chased to the stretch and tired. PEACH OF A DAY, in touch, dropped back gradually through the turn then lacked a closing response. PROMISING SUN hopped at the start, dropped to the rear of the pace and trailed to the end.
