CHRIS'S BAD BOY moved up to duel early on the backstretch, vied from the rail in hand, shook clear at the top of the stretch then was headed in deep stretch but battled back. FRANK'S SELECTION stalked three-wide, closed at the top of the stretch, gained a narrow advantage a sixteenth out but was outfinished. VERY PROFESSIONAL saved ground, stalked the pace and finished all out and gaining late. MY LUCKY STRIKE, unhurried along the rail, angled out at the top of the stretch then finished fastest of all. OPEN CONCERT broke in the air, closed along the rail late turn, finished gamely but needed more. LUCKY TOM was unhurried between horses, angled out slightly at the head of the stretch but lacked a strong rally. THE KING N ROB led quickly and was ,joined in a duel, vied to the top of the stretch and yielded. SIR BLITZ, always in touch, closed four-wide late turn then evened out. SPITFIRE MAN, under a strong hold close up between rivals, tired in the stretch.
