Footnotes

C. C. MOBIL stalked the pace, closed angling five-wide late turn, bid at the 1/4 pole, was headed at the top of the stretch but was under a determined drive and just got up. JOBBER BILL stalked the pace, angled out four-wide and bid late turn, led upper stretch then failed to hold the winner safe at the wire. REXTON raced in midpack, chased hard four and five-wide on the turn, continued all out through the stretch and was gaining late. THERES A REASON, rated early, closed two to four-wide on the turn, chased into the stretch but evened out in the late stages. CATCH THE SECRET, forced out at the start, settled off the pace, was hustled four-wide late turn but failed to menace. THREE DANS dueled on the main track and through the turn, gave way upper stretch and tired after a brief chase. CHAIRMAN GERAMY broke sharply, but outward, was joined on the main track, dueled to upper stretch and tired. FRANK THE BANK closed up to press the pace on the backstretch, chased hard from the rail on the turn but was through at the top of the stretch.
