Footnotes

KENDI LOU pressed the early pace from the inside, opened a clear lead on the turn and continued strong in the drive under intermittent urging. RARE ANTIQUE was steadied at the start and in tight early along the rail, moved off the rail and roused between horses on the turn, then checked again in upper stretch before getting a clear run in the late going. EXPECTED TEMPER was allowed to settle three wide, then roused on the turn and closed the gap, but weakened in the final furlong and dropped back. TAHITI BLUES settled in the second flight between horses, but lacked a late response and was never a threat. BROOM HILDA showed brief speed between horses, then dropped back on the turn. TRUE PETUNIA was away alertly and vied for the early lead three wide, then weakened in the stretch. VENTURE STEAL was allowed to settle between horses, but failed to respond and was never a factor. HIGHLAND ANGEL was in hand between horses, then dropped back on the turn.
