CONVOY BOY stalked the pace from between rivals, moved to the rail into the turn, chased into the stretch, launched an all out bid a furlong out,drove clear and held under steady pressure. TIN PAN ALLEY CAT, close early, dropped back, angled from the rail to four-wide on the turn then rallied gamely. A P VALOR, close early outside, stalked four-wide on the turn, chased into the stretch then finished gamely. VERIDICUS vied, shook clear early turn, was engaged a furlong out and yielded after a brief duel. PROMISING DANCER showed early speed, dropped back at the turn, was hustled along but was not a threat. JOLLY JORDYN stalked from between rivals, chased hard late turn then tired in the final furlong. NO MORE TEARS got off poorly and hit the gate, closed between rivals, was steadied along the rail early turn, was roused in the stretch but had no response.
