CRYSTALIZED CARBON was unhurried in the early going, raced along the rail in the backstretch, made a quick move into the far turn, angled out in upper stretch, assumed command in deep stretch and drew clear. ITS DUECES WILD saved ground around the first turn, went between horses at the 3/8 pole, assumed the command around the 2nd turn, held a clear lead into deep stretch before giving way grudgingly. SIP'N TIME was in hand 3 wide around the first turn, roused in the 2nd turn from the five path and finished with a mild rally. LAVERLOCHERE was unhurried in the early going along the rail, finished evenly in the stretch. SENORITA ROSE pressed the early pace between horses, tired in the 2nd turn and dropped back. CATCH THIS FOOL was allowed to settle, roused 4 wide around the 2nd turn, was no threat. LITTLE OPRAH was allowed to settle, closed the gap 4 wide into the far turn, but failed to sustain the bid. SHUMKA was slow early, raced in the five path around the 2nd turn and passed tiring rivals in the stretch. BOOSTIN HOUSTON stalked the early pace 4 wide, dropped back abruptly around the 2nd turn. OKAS GOLD was unhurried early just off the rail, never rallied. DEVI DEVILLE was hustled along from the inside chasing the early speed, moved off the rail in the backstretch, then tired. STORMPROOF was rushed to the early lead, set a

pressured pace in the backstretch, faltered at the 3/8 pole and faded.
