Footnotes

UNLIKELY ANGEL stalked the early pace 3 wide, assumed command in the 2nd turn and drew clear in the stretch under a drive. SULTERRA was allowed to settle in the early going off the rail, roused between horses into the far turn, came 3 wide mid way through the turn and closed willingly in the stretch. LITTLE OPRAH was in hand between horses, closed the gap on the inside through the 2nd turn, but flattened out in the drive. DIAMOND LEE void of early speed, swung wide 2nd turn, late rally. LUCKY LUCY was unhurried early just off the rail, roused along the rail inside, angled out 3 wide in the 2nd turn and finished with a mild bid. MURPH'S REVENGE saved ground around the first turn, settled in the middle of the pack, made a mild bid around the 2nd turn, but finished evenly. LAVERLOCHERE was unhurried early in the four path, made a mild bid 4 wide through the 2nd turn, but was never a threat. KNOCKGRAFFEN was rushed to the lead, went 3 wide around the first turn, had a clear lead in the backstretch, then tired in the stretch. ITS DUECES WILD was void of early speed and was 4 wide through the first turn, showed little. SENORITA ROSE was off slowly and was wide around the first turn, was

never factor. MAJESTY MAGAZINE was allowed to settle on the inside, but lacked a late response, never a threat. ANNA'S WISH was hustled along between horses, closed the gap at the 3/8 pole, then tired. GOLD SNIFFER was allowed to settle between horses, no rally and was outrun.
