Q AND A was allowed to settle, rallied in the upper stretch on the rail, prevailed through a long drive under firm handling. CORNISH ROSE set the pace and dueled on the lead, gave way grudgingly late. DEADWOOD DESPERADO dueled for the lead, weakened slightly in late stretch. JOHNNY BLACKFOOT was allowed to settle, rallied in the upper stretch, then failed to sustain his bid. TRICKY N' TARA was never a threat. WEISS GUY vied for the lead, gave way on the second turn. SAUNA BOY saved ground and weakened. BOX was no factor and was eased through the wire. UGLYCHARLEY was always outrun and was eased through the wire.
