PERFECTIONISM was three wide while moving into contention on the far turn, was four wide with his bid at the top of the stretch, brushed a rival, dueled to deep stretch then edged clear late. NUMEROUS XS moved along the rail into the far turn, lodged his bid between foes at the top of the stretch, brushed with the winner at that point then couldn't go with the winner late while easily second best. OH LORD was four wide into the first turn then vied for the lead while outside three horses down the backstretch, stayed with the leaders to near mid stretch then weakened. PROUD CAJUN vied for the lead from along the rail inside a three-horse spread and tired the final furlong. QUAKER RUN forced the early pace into the first turn then settled off the leaders into the backstretch, stayed inside and lacked a bid from along the rail. MAIL CAR JOHNNY vied for the lead from between foes into the backstretch, fell back some nearing the half-mile marker, was four wide into the stretch and tired. DIXIELAND MEETING was four wide around the first turn, raced in the five path down the backstretch, took the three path for the stretch and was not a factor.
