Footnotes

OLIVER ZIP lost his footing at the break, argued for command with the runner up while riding the rail, was set down as the half was being completed, drew well clear, crossing the wire under a strong hand drive. LOKI'S VENGEANCE bumped at the start, dueled with the top one while taking the two path, was under encouragement prior to the quarter pole, got shaken off deep into the furlong grounds, continued onward to be second best. LONG ON VALUE tracked the winner loosely pocketed, got asked for some run approaching the five-sixteenths pole, didn't offer any and faltered. GOOD TIME HENNY was bumped and knocked slightly sideways a short distance after the start, sat wedged between rivals in the two path from the half mile pole to the seven-sixteenths marker, tired. HOT HEIR SKIER got bumped very shortly after the start, was in the three path between rivals leaving the backstretch, remained along the same path giving chase on the turn, turned for home having been put to a full drive, made no headway, then drifted out slightly in the final furlong while tiring. GERMANIAC stacked four wide at the half mile pole, continued as the widest off all around the turn, failed to make his presence felt and gave way.
