By subscription of \$500 each which should accompany the nomination, \$750 to pass the entry box, \$1,250 additional to start, with \$250,000 guaranteed to be divided: \$150,000 to the owner of the winner, \$50,000 to second, \$27,500 to third, \$15,000 to fourth and \$7,500 to fifth. Weights: Three year olds 116 lbs; Older 122 lbs. Winners of a Grade/Group I or Grade/Group II in 2010-2011 to carry 2 lbs. additional. Non-winners of an unrestricted stakes in 2010-2011 allowed 3 lbs; of \$30,000 twice since March 28 allowed 5 lbs; of \$30,000 once since then 8 lbs. (Maiden, Claiming and Starter races not considered.) Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. Nominations closed Saturday, May 14, 2011 with 13. A trophy will be presented to the winning owner, trainer and jockey.

INDIAN LEGEND angled inside early, offered a strong bid along the rail on the turn, hooked up with the pacesetter from the top of the stretch, earned a narrow advantage to the eighth pole and held rival safe after a stretch-long duel. TAR HEEL MOM vied inside three across in the first quarter, was engaged from the inside at the quarter pole, lost the advantage and could get get back by after a prolonged battle to the finish. BRILLIANT SUNSHINE chased wide early, advanced in the two path on the turn and was no match for the top pair. LADY LUCINDA dueled between rivals to the far turn, dropped back but continued well while no threat. SWEET GOODBYE dropped back early wide and trailed before passing a rival late, never being a factor. LADY ALEXANDER broke a step slowly, quickly moved to vie three wide but began fading passing the three eighths pole..
