**Footnotes**

HOGY took up a position tracking the leaders from just out of striking distance under light rating in the opening stages, steadily moved to challenge those foes on his own courage nearing upper stretch, continued well off the inside racing through the stretch and produced a steady late response to maintain a clear advantage under pressure. MISTER MARTI GRAS was settled outside foes in the opening half, made steady progress four wide racing into the stretch to gain striking position but couldn't gain terms with the winner while proving best of the others. HAMMERS TERROR shifted to the inside early disputing the pace, dueled for command racing through the turn to upper stretch but weakened nearing the furlong marker. SERUNI was settled off the second flight racing a bit off the rail in the opening half, saved ground on the bend, switched out five wide in upper stretch while being urged to advance between foes and continued with an effort to improve position. PATRIOTICANDPROUD broke awkwardly losing some position to the field, angled to the rail early, then swung seven wide in the closing stages to gains some position while making no real impression on the leaders. HATTAASH, reserved between foes off the second flight racing into the turn, shifted out six wide to race between foes in that path through the stretch but offered no rally. NIGHT PARTY broke readily, was rated outside foes as part of the second flight tracking the leaders, made some brief progress four wide racing into the turn to gain a contending position but steadily faded racing into upper stretch. ALL STORMY tracked the leaders inside foes in the second flight racing to the turn and steadily faded along the inside in late stages. NATES MINESHAFT joined the pace outside a rival soon after the start, pressed the issue racing into the turn and gave way abruptly entering upper stretch.
