CAPE BLANCO (IRE) came away in good order, accompanied the pacesetter from the outside, with the rider matching the rating tactics being applied by the jockey aboard the leader, continued along the same scenario until nearing the far turn, advanced to draw on even terms with MISSION APPROVED by the seven-sixteenths pole, raced as a team with that opponent, began to inch away, having now been roused, as the pilot atop the aforementioned rival still sat chilly, appeared to poke a head in front as the top twosome turned for home, but lost that slim lead, drifting out nearly a path before settling comfortably in upper stretch, resumed his quest for the top, under frantic encouragement, wrested away the lead leaving the eighth pole and kicked well clear of the others, being kept busy to the wire. GIO PONTI sat well reserved in the two path until midpoint on the far turn, picked up interest instantaneously when let out a notch at that station, spun five wide for the stretch drive, commenced to rally in earnest and displayed a good kick en route for the place, although never posing a threat to the top one in the late stages. BOISTEROUS contently tracked the leader from the pocket until the quarter pole, angled outward for the stretch drive, got called upon and got out finished. MISSION APPROVED grabbed the lead in a flash, was well rated setting the opening splits from the inside, felt pressure from the winner soon after entering the second turn, fell ever so slightly behind at the quarter pole, regained the advantage when the top one drifted out a bit entering the stretch, responded well once given hid cue, held stubbornly before relinquishing, weakened steadily in the final sixteenth. AL KHALI unhurried for the opening mile, came from the four path into the stretch, had no rally. BEARPATH took the inside route, was asked for run departing the backstretch, failed to reach a contending position.
