PROUD SPELL bobbled slightly soon after the start, moved up along the inside nearing the first turn, angled to the outside of LITTLE BELLE entering the backstretch, prompted the pace outside that rival to the far turn, closed gradually from outside to challenge midway on the turn, surged to the front approaching the quarter pole, dug in when challenged by MUSIC NOTE inside the furlong marker, battled gamely along the inside into deep stretch and prevailed under left hand urging after a long hard drive. MUSIC NOTE was under a firm hold along the inside on the first turn, moved out along the backstretch, raced in good position to the far turn, launched a rally from outside midway on the turn, angled four wide entering the stretch, make a strong move to challenge inside the furlong marker, fought heads apart from outside through the final sixteenth but couldn't get by the winner while clearly best of the others. LITTLE BELLE rushed up along the rail to gain a clear advantage on the first turn, set the pace in hand along the backstretch, raced uncontested on the front for seven furlongs, relinquished the lead to the winner at the top of the stretch, remained a factor into midstretch and weakened in the final eighth. MUSHKA moved out on the first turn, tracked the leaders four wide for a mile and steadily tired thereafter. SWEET VENDETTA angled in early, raced well back for seven furlongs, gave way on the turn and was eased late then returned bleeding.
