Footnotes

PULSATE off to a clean beginning, got guided over towards the inside, was spaced at a slight distance from off the rail, patiently ridden tracking BACK TO BACK just to that one's left picked up interest when asked as three-quarters was being completed, shoe-horned himself along the rail coming up to the three-sixteenths pole, narrowed in, slipping to the front end prior to the beginning of the last eighth, got engaged in a spirited tussle with the runner up the remainder of the way to the finish line and gamely proved best. THE RIGHT PATH forced out at the start by its errant next door neighbor, recovered and powered up into a forward position, firmly held by the pilot, disputed the pace three wide, matched up with BACK TO BACK, got cued up as their fight spilled over into the lane, saw the winner poke a head in front by the completion of the run leading up to and then through the furlong grounds, went at it eye to eye with that opponent from that juncture onward, got denied. STANDARD DEVIATION broke open the gate, was prevented from running off due to a snug hold being utilized by the rider, proceeded to break forwardly placed and stayed so, at least during the setting of the opening split, dropped back as the tempo picked up quite a bit, failed to get motivated to assume its former prominent position, even with some light stick work in the area of the right shoulder, was switched over to a vigorous hand ride as three-quarters was being reached, angled five wide, the widest of all, into the stretch, straightened away and chugged along to secure the show. TWELFTHOFNEVERLAND corrected after coming out at the start, took up the chase from path three wide on the turn, commenced the stretch slightly wider, continued onward as a factor for another furlong before giving way. BACK TO BACK put to a firm hold after the start, emerged at the top of the backstretch contesting the pace with the second place finisher, slid onto the inside route approaching the half mile pole, got called upon still hooked up with the nemesis as they turned for home, gave it up in midstretch and steadily backed away. TRANCE bumped in his hind quarters in the shadow of the starting gate, sat parked along the overland route on the turn, appeared to have little left by the end of the bend, strolled well off the rail into the lane then was taken in hand and allowed to fade away.
