STAKES Ft. Lauderdale S. Grade 2 - Thoroughbred

FOUR YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. Free nomination by Sunday, December 31. \$2,000 to enter. \$200,000 Guaranteed. After payment of 1% to all owners of horses finishing sixth through last, 62% of the remaining purse shall be paid to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, and 3% to fifth. Weight: 123 lbs. Non-winners of a graded stakes at a mile or over on turf since July 1 allowed 2 lbs.; a stakes race at a mile or over on turf since July 1, 4 lbs.; three races other than maiden, claiming, or starter, 6 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by the usual time of closing. Supplemental nominations may be made at time of entry. All fees shall be paid prior to the start of the race. This race will be limited to 14 starters, with also eligibles. If more than 14 horses are entered, preference will be given to graded stakes winners, then by highest career earnings. In the event this race is taken off the turf, it may be subject to downgrading upon review of the Graded Stakes Committee. Trophy to the winning owner. (If deemed inadvisable to run this race over the turf course, it will be run on the main track at One Mile and One Sixteenth) (Rail at 115 feet).

Footnotes

SHINING COPPER moved up between rivals to clear the lead and angled to inside, saved ground along rail in first turn, briefly loose on top before being challenged by SHAKHIMAT near the half mile marker, held slight edge over rival positioned along inside, shook free past the quarter pole then roused turning for home and emerged clear on top, challenged by ONE GO ALL GO a furlong out, held nose in front, battled back gamely from inside and refused to let rival by. ONE GO ALL GO secured rail position in the first turn and settled nicely in stalking position saving ground through the backstretch, angled out turning for home then moved up with strong response to challenge SHING COPPER for lead, dueled noses apart along outside, dug in gamely but could not get by brave opponent. ALL INCLUDED settled while rated three wide running through the backstretch, gained closer range on top two flights entering the far turn then roused five wide just past the quarter pole, continued with response along outside to gain and secure share. TEAM COLORS saved ground along rail in the first turn then continued unhurried in early stages, took closer order in far turn then sent driving along outside, gained with response then finished evenly and lost share. SHAKHIMAT raced off leader in opening quarter then moved up to engage rival near the half mile marker, dueled along outside of SHINING COPPER latter half of backstretch until quarter pole, could not move on for lead then retreated in lane. DIAMOND BACHELOR raced off the pace then saved ground along rail in far turn, failed to rally in the lane. HEART TO HEART reared in air at the start then lost path between when eventual winner angled in going by the wire for first time, tossed head wanting to go then stalked through the backstretch, was well positioned in aim three wide at the quarter pole, given cue then lost ground and kick turning for home then retreated. SUMMER CAUSEWAY raced in the back then dropped far back.
