PRINCESS OF SYLMAR unhurried, tipped outward to be the widest of all shortly after entering the backstretch, continued to bid time well reserved for the rest of the way along it, was let out a notch and launched a solid run from the four path to latch on to the front runners by the five-sixteenths marker, forged on ahead and poked a head down in front as the field spun into the stretch, responded positively when set down, drew well clear, kept busy to the end. MY HAPPY FACE off to a good beginning, quickly established control, took up residence in the two path, set the initial fractions, being rated and facing some but light pressure, had it pick up in intensity after the third fraction had been recorded, got put to a stern test both by the winner and MARATHON LADY at the five-sixteenths marker, lost the lead by the head of stretch despite asked for some run prior to relinquishing, fell back steadily making her way down the lane, but finished willingly nonetheless to secure second. MARATHON LADY sat forwardly placed three wide around both turns, ranged up, with the top one in tow one path to her outside leaving the half mile pole, challenged in earnest from between rivals for a furlong starting from the five-sixteenths pole, before tiring in the last eighth. CUE THE MOON loosely drafted behind the runner up, got asked for run shortly before tucking along the rail a couple of jumps before reaching the quarter pole, had clear sailing available but lacked the needed response. UNLIMITED BUDGET got off a beat slowly after striking the right side of the starting gate, tucked along the rail well before the end of the homestretch, kept pace in the pocket to the half mile pole, dropped back steadily leaving that station, drifted four wide into upper stretch with little left to offer.
