BACKCOUNTRY BOY was kept off the early activity up front under a good hold while racing along the outside, chose to enter the stretch from the five path after finding himself behind a wall of rivals approaching the quarter pole, quickly settled into his rally after being roused in upper stretch, made steady progress during the run through the furlong grounds, reached even terms with the leader with an eighth to go, shook free of that rival in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole and drew away under busy handling. APPLIEDORE swept into contention with a four wide bid around the turn, while keeping something in reserve, took charge soon after turning for home, was joined by the top one just past the furlong marker, battled heads apart until the sixteenth pole, succumbed at that point but continued on with good courage to garner place honors. CONFLICTED raced three wide and proved no match for the pair during the stretch drive. TAPITDAR pressed the leader from outside, grabbed the front nearing the quarter pole, gave it up in upper stretch and tired steadily thereafter. LUBASH reluctant to load prior to the start, never threatened. SMOKIN CONRAD took the inside route, came out briefly to move past a fading rival in upper stretch, ducked back inward but had nothing left to offer. RIVER SMOKE was outrun. FELICE DI NOTTE tired after going a half.
