CHARITABLE MAN was unhurried along the backstretch, stalked the leaders while five wide on the far turn, closed the gap from outside to threaten nearing the quarter pole, surged to the front with a furlong remaining and edged away under a vigorous hand ride. FLYING PEGASUS was under a firm hold while between horses through the opening quarter mile, pressed the leaders three wide to the top of the stretch, battled heads apart for the lead at the three-sixteenths pole, fought gamely inside the winner into deep stretch and held well to clearly beat the others. FRIESAN FIRE was unhurried in the early going, raced behind a wall of horses while trailing to the top of the stretch, angled out in upper stretch and rallied belatedly to gain a share. GIROLAMO was under a firm hold while between horses along the backstretch, raced just off the pace for five furlongs, lodged a mild move between rivals in upper stretch and finished evenly. GONE ASTRAY was well in hand for a half mile while saving ground, lacked clear sailing while trapped along the rail nearing the quarter pole, angled out slightly in upper stretch and lacked the needed response when called upon. KENSEI dueled between horses for five furlongs, gained a brief lead in upper stretch and weakened from his early efforts. HIGH MESA rushed up along the rail, dueled inside to the top of the stretch and steadily tired thereafter.
