Dirt weights: Non-winners of a sweepstake on the dirt in 2010-11 allowed 3 lbs.; \$30,000 on the dirt in 2010-11 or four races on the dirt 5 lbs. (Maiden, claiming and starter races not considered in allowances). A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track. Closed Saturday, October 8, 2011 with 31 Nominations. (S)

COMPLIANCE OFFICER took up residence in the pocket soon after the start, contently tracked the pacesetter from there, swung outside the two front runners coming to the three-sixteenths pole, commenced his rally without missing a beat, surged by to take charge leaving the eighth pole and drew off smartly, crossing the wire under a brisk hand ride. LUBASH was rated prompting the leader from the outside, continued along on the same scenario until nearing the end of the far turn, got set down and bid in earnest heading into the stretch, never got the lead but continued on willingly en route for the place. ADIRONDACK SUMMER sat reserved along the inside during the opening stages, made a rail run to reach a good striking position by the quarter pole,

angled three wide for stretch run, got outfinished. WRITINGONTHEWALL kicked away to a loose lead right from the get-go, cut the pace with the rider atop with a good hold on the reins and did so until nearing the quarter pole, felt some pressure for the initial time was asked for run in response but readily yielded. MINNIE PUNT unhurried for the nearly three-quarters pole, was placed five wide commencing the stretch run, ducked in sharply making it all the way to the rail during the run through the furlong grounds, flattened out. KARAKORUM LEGEND three wide on the opening bend, tucked into two path entering the backstretch, sat within range from there from between rivals for a good portion of the way down the backstretch and around the far turn, failed to fire when called upon in upper stretch. POCKET COWBOYS strung out three wide around both turns, folded. MISSINGLISALEWIS lunged at the break and was never involved. PIANO STAR was never in the hunt. JOE CORRIGAN four wide departing the backstretch, trailed.
