SKIPADATE was well reserved during the opening three-quarters, angled outward gearing up for the stretch drive, was set down after settling into the six path at the top of the lane, charged down the outside of the course to close in on the front runners, surged by to take over at the sixteenth pole and drew clear. BANGALORE GOLD (IRE) off a beat slowly, rode the hedge. was eased outward nearing the quarter pole, took off in earnest after being called upon in upper stretch, closed with good energy to be along in time for the place. SR. HENRY was forwardly placed while undergoing a wide journey, responded well when set down turning for home, loomed a serious threat with an eighth to go, was herded out a bit by LUBASH in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, bumping with SHEILA'S MAGIC, then continued on with good courage en route for the show. LUBASH was rated on a loosely-contested lead along the inside until the quarter pole, offered good resistance when challenged turning for home, came outward in reaction to left handed pressure coming to the sixteenth pole while weakening in the late stages. OIL MAN (IRE) under a good hold outside until the upper stretch, rallied into contention after turning for

home, then was brushed and forced to steady around the sixteenth pole. INTERPATATION three wide around the second turn, was coaxed along to keep pace, fanned wide into the lane, began the stretch run stacked six wide, but needed more. FOLLOWMYFOOTSTEPS took the inside route, angled outward in upper stretch, closed in, was stick in the thick of the battle when forced to steady after LUBSH came out, losing his best opportunity. CRISTOBAL saved ground throughout. SHEILA'S MAGIC three wide around the opening bend, went on to stalk the leader a bit closer to the rail, kept up mild pressure until the quarter pole, issued a more serious challenge nearing the head of the lane, battled onward, until being bumped in tight quarters pole just past the sixteenth pole. AT THE DISCO three wide around both turns, gave way. BARRIER REEF forwardly placed along the outside for three-quarters, folded. There was a Stewards' Inquiry focusing on the stretch run before the result was declared official.
