FOR THREE-YEAR-OLDS. By subscription of \$150 each on or before April 12, 2003 or by Supplementary Nomination of \$7,500 at the time of entry. \$750 to pass the entry box; \$750 additional to start, with \$150,000 added of which 62% of all monies to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth and 3% to fifth. Weight 122 lbs. Non-winners of \$50,000 allowed 2 lbs.; three races other than maiden or claiming, 4 lbs.; two races other than maiden or claiming, 6 lbs.; a race other than maiden or claiming, 8 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box at the usual time of closing. All supplementary nominations will be required to pay entry and starting fees if they participate. Trophy to winning owner.

Footnotes

MIDAS EYES drifted in at the start bumping with MINER MOSS, gained a slight lead while racing inside of CHAMPALI under light restraint, edged clear soon after the opening quarter, was put to energetic hand urging entering the upper stretch, received one slap of the whip on the right side soon after, then continued under hand encouragement the remainder. CHAMPALI, in a bit tight after the start when lightly bumped from both sides, went up soon after four wide to track MIDAS EYES, raced within easy striking distance while outside that one into the stretch, couldn't produce the needed response but was superior to the others. DESERT WARRIOR came out at the start bumping MINER MOSS, settled behind horses, moved up between foes soon after the opening quarter, remained prominent into the stretch but flattened out in the drive. MINER MOSS, bumped from both sides after the start, settled inside, saved ground to the stretch, came out four wide for the drive, improved position but couldn't menace. PRIVATE GOLD came out at the break lightly bumping with CHAMPALI, raced in behind the leaders three or four wide on the backstretch, angled near the inside on the turn, continued in that manner the remainder but was empty. UNBRIDLED AMERICA leaned in bumping CHAMPALI at the start, followed the leaders within striking distance to the stretch and tired.
