SILVER SEASON, reserved in behind the pace duel, angled out after entering the stretch, rallied to gain command at the eighth pole and drew off under a hand ride. DEEP GOLD vied for the lead three wide and continued on with good courage for the place while being outfinished by the winner. NIGHT PATROL stalked the pace, drew even four wide on the turn, then weakened in the final eighth. HOTCHILDINTHECITY, outrun early, passed tired rivals. SAN GENNARO saved ground and lacked the needed rally. TODAY'S TOMORROW, off slowly, moved up quickly to vie for the lead between horses into the stretch and gave way. LIFEISAWHIRL chased the pace four wide after breaking poorly and tired. SPIRITOFSPAIN was steadied when he broke to the inside, then steadied again on the backstretch and was not a factor. GOLDEN RETURNS, broke poorly, moved up to vie for the lead along the rail into the stretch and faltered.
