FOR THREE YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. Free nomination by Saturday, February 7. \$300 to pass the entry box; \$300 additional to start. Supplemental nominations of \$1,000 will be accepted at time of entry which shall include all fees. \$60,000 guaranteed of which 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 4% to fourth 2% to fifth and 1% to starters sixth through ninth. Weights: Three Year Olds 117 lbs. Older 123 lbs. Non-winners of \$35,000 since December 21, allowed 2 lbs, \$25,000 since November 21, allowed 4 lbs. \$20,000 since then allowed 6 lbs. Starters to be named through the entry box by usual time of closing. The Duncan F. Kenner Stakes will be limited to fourteen (14) starters. Preference will be given to horses that have accumulated the highest total earnings in 2014-2015. Any horse excluded from running because of the aforementioned preference shall be refunded the entry fee or supplementary nomination fee if applicable. A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. Closed Saturday, February 7, 2015, with 15 nominations.

### Footnotes

BET SEATTLE showed good speed on the outside, set the clear pace, controlled the action while a bit off the rail on the turn, turned into the stretch under his own power, was asked coming to the furlong marker and held under a hand ride while being flashed with the whip. DELAUNAY moved outside of BET SEATTLE after being beaten to the lead by that rival, tracked on the outside, chased two to three wide on the turn, dropped further behind while under a left-handed whip in upper stretch, switched to a right-handed whip at the eighth-pole, gained ground back on the winner in the final furlong and finished willingly but missed. TOO DIM reared badly at the start, spotted the field about four to five lengths, settled at the rear, saved ground on the turn, came under the whip in upper stretch and finished willingly for the show. TAKE IT LIKE A MAN chased the pace, raced inside on the turn and tired.
