CLAWBACK got lightly bumped from both sides at the start, showed no ill effects and assumed a forward position, patiently accompanied the pacesetter from the outside, pilot sitting atop with a firm grip on the reins, cruised up upon departing the backstretch, slowly but steadily cut into the margin, poked a head down in front spinning into the stretch, was allowed to settle for a stride or two in upper stretch before getting released from the previously-described hold, scampered away to win comfortably, crossing the wire under a brisk hand ride. WINNING CAUSE fell to his face at the break, spotting the field a several length head start, was immediately put to some hand urging after the disastrous beginning, rode the rail down the backstretch, but tipped into the two path coming to the end of it, was already under a full drive turning for home, showed good courage to garner the place. RUBYSANDPEARLS made light contact with the top one at the start, went on to secure the early advantage, led the field of five taking the inside route, feeling pressure from a well-rated opponent all the while, got put to the test near the bottom of the bend, was set down but relinquished nonetheless and tired. IN THE FAIRWAY got brushed at the start, chased three wide for a half before backing away. MEEKER AVENUE was angled over sharply to the rail in the vicinity of the half mile pole, faltered off the subsequent ground-saving journey.
