FUSAICHI PEGASUS broke alertly and raced close up inside early, was eased back and angled to the outside on the backstretch, advanced quickly while four wide on the turn, cruised by the leaders in upper stretch then held EL CORREDOR safe under an energetic hand ride. EL CORREDOR raced close up inside for three quarters, angled to the outside in upper stretch and finished gamely but could not get to the winner. ALBERT THE GREAT was sent up inside to get the lead, set the pace along the inside, could not stay with the winner in midstretch and weakened in the final furlong. BIG E E showed good speed from the outside, chased the pace while three wide and tired after the opening three quarters. HOOK AND LADDER argued the pace while between rivals and tired in the stretch. CONCERNED MINISTER was hustled along to keep up but had no response when roused.
