ARTEMIS AGROTERA assumed the role of primary pursuer shortly after the start, rated kindly prompting the leader from the two path for the opening three-quarters, was given her cue for the drive home and responded positively, dug in with good determination to fend off SWEET REASON. SWEET REASON broke well behind the field after swerving in sharply as the field was sent on its way, was allowed to settle into stride saving ground for most of the way down the backstretch, was in the two path by the head of the turn, moved into midpack, achieving the goal under her own power, swung outward until poised to strike from the four path at the top of the lane, rallied with good courage down the center of the strip gaining ground steadily on the resolute winner, but had to settle for being second best. STOPCHARGINGMARIA chased three wide and proved no match. DIVIDED ATTENTION saved ground for nearly three-quarters, commenced the stretch four wide and rallied willingly to grab the last major check. RIA ANTONIA tracked the front runners while saving ground until upper stretch and faltered. TEA TIME quickly took charge, cut the pace being rated along on a loosely-contested for a good majority of the initial six furlongs, arrived at the quarter pole facing intensified pressure and got let out in response, relinquished before completing the next furlong and backed away. RECEPTA three wide and set down at the five-sixteenths pole, folded.
